Anti-Ragging POLICY

I. Policy:

The institution has a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging: As per the order of Supreme Court of India, GOI and mandate of the University Grants Commission (UGC), the College has constituted the Anti Ragging Cell to prevent and eradicate any form of ragging from the college campus as well as the college hostels (both Boys' and Girls'). The Anti-Ragging cell ensures that the Campus is free from any kind of ragging and encourages an ideal and congenial atmosphere for all the students.

II. Objectives of the Policy:

The Policy of Anti-Ragging, that forms the cornerstone of the student-friendly orientation of the institution, is aimed at achieving the following objectives:

- Spreading constant awareness among the students about the dehumanizing effect of ragging inherent in it.
- Maintaining constant vigilance so as to prevent the occurrence of ragging in any shape or form.
- Dealing promptly and stringently with the incidents of ragging brought to the notice of the concerned body.
- Generating an atmosphere of discipline by sending a clear message that no act of ragging shall be tolerated and any act of ragging shall not go unnoticed and unpunished.
- Framing guidelines and norms for making the college campus ragging free.
- Providing value education that would instill the value of humane behavior within the entire student body.

III. Procedure:

- Information is conveyed to the students about zero-tolerance towards ragging through the admission prospectus along with admission form, through the college website so that the candidates and their parents/guardians are sensitized in respect of the prohibition and the consequences of ragging.
- Complaint Box is placed at relevant places within the campus.
- All admitted students are required to submit a duly signed undertaking to the effect that the candidate is aware of the law regarding prohibition of ragging as well as the punishments if found guilty of the offence of ragging and/or abetting ragging.
- All guardians must submit duly signed undertaking forms to the effect that he/she is also aware of the law in this regard and agrees to abide by the punishment meted out to his/her ward in case the latter is found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging.
- At the commencement of the academic session, Induction Programs and anti-ragging campaigns are organized to spread awareness among the students about the dehumanizing effects of ragging.
- Various seminars and awareness camps are continually arranged in order to educate students on what kind of behavior constitutes ragging and the ill-effects of the same and what punishment can befall the culprit who engages in such activities.
- Boards and posters are displayed at various sites within the campus to caution students of indulgence in ragging.
- Head of the Institution, as well as all Departmental Heads and Hostel In-Charges maintain strict vigilance in order to prevent ragging.
- The entire campus is under CCTV surveillance that allows the activities of the students to be recorded and monitored.
- Anti-Ragging helpline numbers of the members of the cell are displayed at different places within the campus to facilitate easy complaint lodging by the candidates.

IV. Compliance, Monitoring and Review:

- As per UGC Regulations 2009, the Anti-Ragging policy is followed by the institution.
- Action is taken immediately upon the receiving of any complaint.
- Reported cases are resolved within 7 working days.

- Complete transparency is maintained in the process of resolving the cases.
- Regular meetings of the Anti-Ragging Cell are held and the Cell reports its actions and proceedings of the meeting to the appropriate Authority.

V. Penal Measures:

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging in the campus or even outside the campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withdrawing scholarships and other benefits.
- Suspension from the college and/or hostel.
- Cancellation of the admission.
- Withholding the results.
